CELEBRATING 100 YEARS HONORING THE PAST EMBRACING THE FUTURE 1919 & 2019

1919 - In the early 1900's, during the first World War there was a ground swell of "Colored" Negroes filled with despair. By the direction of God, the founders of New Prospect Missionary Baptist Church chose to head for the promise of a better life in the North, along with an estimated 500,000 other Negroes. The great migration from the South to the North was on!

One of the 500,000 Negroes that migrated from the South was E. A. Bentley. Records are sketchy, but it is believed that Mr. Bentley was a Deacon at a church in Alabama. By the Grace of God, he ended up in Cincinnati, OH and this is where our story begins...


God gave Deacon Bentley the idea for a church. He had the ability to motivate ten believers in Jesus Christ, who followed the direction of the Holy Spirit.

2019 - New Prospect has created an oasis in the middle of the city by taking an abandoned site with 22 acres of land in the Roselawn community of Cincinnati and building a church with a community center available for people from all walks of life to engage with one another. NPBC has the opportunity to provide a location that will serve the community with programming that will enhance their lives. There are over 20 ministries dedicated to enriching spiritual growth and enhancing our church fellowship for Couples, Men, Women, New Members, Mission, Academic Enrichment, College Scholarships and more. In the pages to follow you will find a vast history that spans 100 years. These are just a few of the highlights, milestones, and facts of a church that serves the community and seeks to be the "Village Well". The One place in the community that is essential to all life. Over the past 100 years we have been Blessed to do great works for the city of Cincinnati.





1921 – Rented first Storefront for Regular Church Fellowship.


1922 - Met and worshipped at 234 George Street.

1924 – New Location for Worship Service at 1135 Gest & Harriet Street.

1925 – Worship at 1101 Oehler Street.

1930 – New Prospect sold its property at 1101 Oehler Street to purchase a site at 422 Clinton Street.

1944 - New Prospect burned the mortgage located at 422 Clinton Street.





THE HISTORY OF NEW PROSPECT BAPTIST CHURCH (NPBC)

1919 - 2019 TIMELINE OF NOTEWORTHY EVENTS

August 13, 1919 - Rev. Mason and Deacon E.A. Bentley organized New Prospect Baptist Church with nine other believers.

They worshipped at the home of Deacon William Smith.

1919 - Reverend Kelly was called to become the Pastor (1919-1920).

The 1920's

- 1920 The church body moved into a rented building on Lincoln Terrace.
- 1921 Reverend Mason became the Interim Pastor after Reverend Kelly resigned. The growing church of 17 active members met regularly in a rented building on Lincoln Terrace in Walnut Hills.
- 1920 1922 Reverend Troup became the Pastor after Reverend Mason resigned. The church moved and held services in a storefront at 234 George Street. There were 32 faithful members at that time. Reverend A. Fuller became the Interim Pastor in June of 1922 after Reverend Troup resigned with ill health. The First Senior Usher Board was established.
- 1923 Reverend Carl H. Lee was called to be the Pastor in July 1923. A savings fund drive was started to buy land for a building.
- 1924 A church committee appointed to find an ideal location. The church moved to 1135 Gest Street. Reverend C. B. Heath became the Pastor in February 1924 after Reverend Lee resigned. The Missionary Society was formed to provide mission service to the community and congregation.
- 1925 William Farrell became Pastor after Reverend Lee. He was Pastor of NPBC from 1925-1939. Missionary Society continued to do field work and mission service for the community and church body.
- 1926 General Mission Ministry organized to win souls for Christ.

The 1930's

- 1930 The Willing Workers Club organized to service the elderly and help with other projects. The property at 1101 Oehler Street was sold. Trustees organized the purchase of land at 422 Clinton Street and the congregation moved into building.
- 1933 The Nurses Guild organized to care for members who needed minor medical attention during church services.
- 1937 NPBC's Inspirational Choir was formed and the congregation grew to almost 200 members.
- 1939 A series of interim Pastors stood in the gap after Reverend Farrell resigned.

The 1940's

- 1940 The Volunteer Club was organized.
- 1941 Congregation grew to over 300 members and Reverend A.L.

 Collins was called to become Pastor. The 422 Clinton Street building was renovated, and new pews were purchased to accommodate the growth of the church. Members of the church were drafted into armed services during World War II.
- 1942 Senior Choir performed as background singers for celebrated
 African-American singer, actor, and black activist, Paul Robeson.
 NPBC moved to Oehler Street location.

The 1950's

1950 – Edgar Rootes, a member from England, purchased the first Public Address (P.A.) system for the church. He later helped to finance the education of many NPBC youth.



Members from 1950-1955

- 1951 Church purchases 1829 Elm Street, known as "The Motion Picture Theater."
- 1952 Cincinnati Board of Education acquired the church's property on 422 Clinton Street to make room to build Taft High School. The 1829 Elm Street property was converted into a place of worship after substantial renovation. The congregation of almost 350 members moved into the new church in the "Over-the-Rhine" community.




Members from 1950-1955

- 1956 New Prospect Male Chorus was formed.
- 1957 Fellowship with churches in the South began, including Beulah Baptist Church and Trinity Baptist Church.
- 1959 While Reverend Collins was very ill, the worship services were conducted by Reverend Bimbo and Reverend Heard.

The 1960's

1960 – The ongoing illness of Pastor Collins presented challenges. New Prospect struggled during this time to maintain its membership because of a lack of consistency within leadership.

A split occurred in the NPBC membership when approximately 50 members relocated with Reverend Bimbo to the newly formed Philippian Baptist Church.





The 1960's

1961 – A dedicated member mortgaged his home to pay for new carpeting for the church. All members who could, helped finance beautification efforts. Reverend Collins retired after a long illness.

The NPBC Deacon Board invited Reverend T. L. Lane to lead a revival for the church with the potential of becoming the church's next pastor.

Pastor T.L. Lane was called to pastor the church. He was a visionary who led the church for 29 years. He was very active in the Civil Rights movement and always tried to help advance the church and the congregation.

1962 – Things were turning around for the church. Members who left the church began to return under the new leadership. 225 members were added – 75 members were by Baptism. Young Adult Chorus was organized.

Pastor T.L. Lane, church members and other church pastors, attended the Civil Rights March in Washington D.C. when Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. delivered the "I Have A Dream" speech.

The 1960's (Continued)

- 1964 First Youth Director guided the spiritual growth of the youth, their Motto became "Use Them or Lose Them." Projects included bowling, skating, songfest, International Tea and more.

 Reverend Lane became the Moderator of the Cincinnati Missionary Baptist District Association. NPBC had a strong presence in the District, by holding many leadership positions.
- 1965 Reverend Lane, Reverend Shuttlesworth and members of NPBC helped to pave the way for civil rights and voting rights for blacks, both acts passed in 1965. Church began a major savings program to purchase a new building. New Prospect attained land to build a new church. There were 65 members in the Evangelical Choir.
- 1967 The church baptized 224 members.
- 1968 The Ever Ready Club was formed, this group of women helped with fundraising activities.
- 1969 Church began a major fundraising program for the growing church. Clubs and auxiliaries raised funds with rummage sales, cookouts, fashion shows and more. Church leaders sought funding from banks and other lending institutions.

- 1973 The old theater building was demolished. The congregation was relocated to a leased building at 3126 Reading Road in Avondale.
- 1974 The church remained strong during building of the new church and continued to fulfill its mission.
- 1975 On April 6, at 9:00 a.m. the NPBC congregation marched from Washington Park to the new church on Elm Street. Pastor T.L. Lane delivered his first sermon from the new pulpit. It was standing room only.
- 1976 A member of the trustee board purchased the church's first minivan.
- 1977 The Busy Bee Club was started to raise money to off-set expenses of the new church. The Ohio Baptist State Convention convened at New Prospect. It was one of the first sessions ever held.
- 1979 The Mass Choir was formed.

The 1980's

- 1980 The "Give Me My Flowers" program was started, which allowed members to give flowers to someone they wanted to thank.
- 1983 The "Mic Committee" orchestrated fundraising for a state-of-theart public address system in the church, which was installed later that year.
- 1985 First New Members Class was started and many instructors were trained to lead this six-week course.
- 1987 Sister Edith Gaines resigned as President of the Willing Workers
 Club after serving for 40 years. Under her leadership,
 membership grew and the club became a major fundraising
 group to help support the church. Bobbie King became the
 Minister of Music and served at NPBC for fifteen years.
- 1989 Pastor T. L. Lane became ill while preaching and instructed Deacon Raleigh Carter to contact young Damon (Lynch, III) to serve as the interim pastor.

The 1990's

1990 - Due to Pastor T. L. Lane's
extended illness he retired,
marking the end of an era
which spanned nearly 29 years.

Pastor Damon Lynch, III was installed. During this event, the Rev. Damon Lynch Jr., Pastor of New Jerusalem Baptist Church and father of Rev. Lynch, shared his memorable "Letter to My Son."

The NPBC Mission Statement was established: "To edify the savior, evangelize the sinner, educate the saints and elevate society." Motto: "To build a healthy community one soul at a time through Worship, Word, Witness and Work."

The Congregational Care Ministry and the Teen Choir "S.O.U.L." was organized.


- 1991 The tutorial program for children was created.
- 1992 Due to the explosive growth, an 8:00 a.m. Sunday morning worship service was established to alleviate the overcrowding of our 11:00 a.m. service. Feed 5000 Program was started to feed those in the Over-the-Rhine community every third Saturday. Children's Church was established, and meetings were held every second and third Sunday. Teen Ministry, TAPS (Teens Against Pre-Marital Sex) was organized. Organized recreational activities such as a baseball and football teams began, as well as classes for self-defense. Greeters Ministry was formed.

- 1992 (Continued) NPBC purchased the "The Blue House" 1823 Elm Street.

 Additional ministries were started such as: the Senior Citizens
 Ministry, Sisters United/Little Sisters, College Ministry, Bible
 discussion "Cell Groups", Marriage Enrichment Ministry, Sign
 Language Ministry & The Travel Ministry.
- 1993 Single Parent Support Group was organized.
- 1994 The church mortgage was burned on the church anniversary.

 The New Prospect Development Corporation was established to offer programs and services for the church and community.

 The following buildings were purchased 1807, 1809, 1811, 1813, 1819, and 1821 Elm Street (Heaven's Bread Bakery & Deli formerly Busken's Bakery). The Prison Ministry was organized.
- 1996 Media Ministry was organized.
- 1998 Senior Choir was renamed to the Inspirational Choir. The Mass Choir was reorganized to become The Voices of Praise. A special event called the Hallelujah Block Party was organized. The Capital Campaign Committee was organized to raise funds to establish an Education Center.
- 1999 The Health and Wellness Ministry was organized.

THE 21ST CENTURY

The 2000's

2000 – The Handbell Choir, Steppers for Christ, Singles Ministry, Nursery for children ages 0-4, and the Praise Dancers were organized.

2001 – As a result of the 2001 riots a curfew was implemented for all residents in the Over-The-Rhine Community.

Pastor Lynch and the church became involved in the City's unrest and took to the streets to diffuse the violence. They ministered outside the walls of the physical church to the people of the community through prayer, quenching thirst, feeding bodies as well as souls.

NPBC added a nightly worship service that occurred every night called The New Wineskins Ministry which consisted of worship, feeding, and overnight lodging for the Over-The-Rhine Community residents.

After the service of the Minister of Music, Bobbie King he was followed by Quincy Tarva Durand, George Dawkins, Phillip Ayers, Willie Thompson, and currently, Jerome Johnson, Jr.

- 2002 The Civil Rights Torch was passed from Pastor Fred Shuttlesworth to Pastor Damon Lynch, III, and he was awarded the Rosa Parks Award from the National Chapter of The Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC). Pastor Lynch received the Theodore Berry Award from the local NAACP.
- 2003 Pastor Chris Battle became our
 Assistant Pastor and Director of
 Christian Education as his former
 church New Creation Community
 Christian Church became a part of
 NPBC on Thanksgiving Day.



- 2004 NPBC visit Disney World. 189 people Joined, 47 people Baptized.
- 2005 Fresh Anointing ministry was birthed. Youth attend KAA. NPBC provided Disaster Relief for Hurricane Katrina in New Orleans & Mississippi. 139 people Joined, 58 people Baptized.
- 2006 NPBC raised money for a Well in Kitale, Kenya. The church began raising money for a Senior Bus. NPBC held a Father's Day Festival. 79 people Joined, 68 people Baptized.
- 2007 NPBC held the OTR Summer Home. 162 people Joined, 63 people Baptized.
- 2008 Renovation of the kitchen at 1829 Elm began. NPBC went to see the play Color Purple in New York. Pastor Chris Battle was called to Tabernacle Baptist Church in Knoxville, TN. NPBC supported him by going to his installation. 171 people Joined, 62 people Baptized.

- 2009 With the church continuing its rapid growth, plans were launched to relocate the church to a larger space. With a vision to further the kingdom of Christ and empower the African American community in Greater Cincinnati. NPBC supported Pastor Lynch as he danced competitively for Cincinnati's "Dancing with the Stars". NPBC held their first Marriage Retreat. 259 people Joined, 94 people Baptized. The church worked together to financially support a new site.
- 2010 After an extensive three-year capital campaign effort, the church purchased a 102,929 square-foot building on 22 acres of land at 1580 Summit Road (our present location). Pastor Lynch and the trustees signed documents on March 18, 2010 and received keys to the property. The first phase of the new building began with plans to further the Kingdom of Christ and continue to fulfill the church's mission, "More ministries, more space, more souls." We raised money for Haiti relief. 217 people Joined, 91 people Baptized.
- 2011 Reverend Paul Booth, Jr. was appointed by Pastor Lynch to serve as the Executive Pastor for Church Ministries. Under the leadership of Rev. Booth, The Vision Works Committee was established to manage the rebranding of the church at the church-wide retreat. NPBC provided disaster relief for the tornadoes in Tuscaloosa, Alabama. 162 people Joined, 71 people



2012 – 1821 Elm Street was sold. The Expansion Launching Committee was established to assist with the transition of the church's move from 1829 Elm Street to 1580 Summit Road. They were also charged to launch activities in the Roselawn Community.

- 2012 (Continued) The committee identified eight Frontline Ministries (Ushers, Greeters, Hospitality, Parking, Nursery, Media, Intake Coordinator, and the Connection Team. The committee implemented a Servant System and Workshop for the Frontline Ministries entitled 1st Impressions "How to Serve 101". 220 people Joined, 110 people Baptized
- 2013 Church-wide retreat was held in Batavia, OH. NPBC sold the remaining Elm Street properties (except 1829 Elm Street). 126 people joined, 29 people baptized.
- 2014 The church moved and held its first service at 1580 Summit, North Campus on Easter, Sunday, April 20th. Services were held at both locations New Prospect South (1829 Elm St.) and New Prospect North (1580 Summit Rd.).

Pastor Lynch appointed Dr. James Wilson to serve as the Executive Pastor and Director of Church Ministries. NPBC added a third Sunday service at 7:00 p.m. as a live radio broadcast. The community and NPBC have become close knit partners in providing space for job fairs, classes, sports team practices, musical events and benefits, voting sites, youth employment facilitators, emergency preparedness headquarters, as well as a host of other events. The Ignition Film School, The Anglers (Fishing) Ministry and The 2nd Chance Boutique Thrift Store were also created.

- 2015 NPBC opened a Free Summer Day Camp at The Summit Center.

 NPBC held its first Donkey Basketball game. The Respite Care

 Ministry was started. God's Chosen Diamonds were showcased and NPBC held a Black Friday Football Fun and Fellowship Day.
- 2016 NPBC Imhotep Imitators won 1st place in the Greater Cincinnati Science Bowl. NPBC Mass Choir Concert was held at the Aronoff Center, which coincided with their first CD release. NPBC held their 1st Tent Revival at our new home 1580 Summit Rd. The first Countdown to Christmas was held.
- 2017 The "In The City Development Corporation" a foundation arm of NPBC purchased a house located at 1588 Summit Rd. next door to the current church location on December 27th.

NPBC opened the Pool of Bethesda Center (Spiritual, Health & Wellness Ministry). Established by Min. Brenda Kennedy, the first Ordained, female minister at NPBC.

The 1st Spring Break Camp was held. NPBC held 1st Blood drive.

- 2018 NPBC was chosen by the Reds Community Fund Foundation, for a Community Makeover which included: Baseball Field, Campgrounds, Community Café, Teen Center, Makerspace and a 2nd Kitchen on the lower level. These renovations have led to a partnership with Great Parks of Hamilton County.
- 2019 During the first quarter, we have held several events for the community including a dinner & food basket giveaway for furloughed government workers. A Community Center for Seniors is in the final renovation phase. NPBC also supports small businesses by providing affordable rental space.
